1. ROSELLE: FROM THE ROMAN TOWN TO THE BISHOPRIC

The town of Roselle is the central place of a large region since the Etruscans (600 BC) and it became a Roman town and a medieval bishopric. It was abandoned before AD 1400. The excavation will focus on a medieval tower and the surrounding area close to the SE gate of the Etruscan walls that has been used for the whole time span. The summer school lasts 3 weeks in June 2018.



2. ROSELLE: MAKING A URBAN GIS FOR CULTURAL HERITAGE.

GIS is used to make complex maps and store data. Students will elaborate the data of the excavation in the town of Roselle and will practice advanced tools for spatial analyses too. The summer school lasts 2 weeks in July 2018.
